## **Background**

From January 2021, all large physical **electrical and electronic retailers**\* (band A and B) will be obliged to accept consumers' old electricals in store for recycling. We've worked with BEIS to develop this toolkit of communications to help ensure consistency across all consumer communications relating to retailer take-back.

- Minimum requirement retailers will need to accept old electricals that they sell on a like-for-like basis, meaning if you buy a charger from your local electrical retailer then you can drop off your old one there
- For some electrical and electronic retailers they will go over and above the basic requirements and will accept more eg. Currys already accept any old electricals at any store, regardless of whether you bought a new electrical item there
- Brands with multi-site stores selling a variety of different products may need to communicate differently in different stores, and should ensure that store staff advise consumers, that larger goods can only be returned to specific stores.

<sup>\*</sup>Current band C members of the DTS and online retailers without physical, retail premises will be required to offer take back from January 2022



## Why should you promote retailer take-back?

- not just doing it because legislation has forced you to
- The <u>way</u> you communicate and implement retailer take-back will strongly influence these perceptions



## Minimum requirement for retailer take-back communications

We've worked with OPSS/ BEIS to develop this Communications toolkit to help ensure consistency across all consumer communications relating to retailer take-back. In the toolkit you'll find **key editable assets** that you can adapt to your own retailer branding.

We have included the following in the toolkit to ensure your comms comply with the regulations

- Strut card at till, or in-store poster editable
- Point of sale ideally BEIS have asked for communication at the points in the store where you sell electricals
- Website content to explain more about WEEE regulations and advise customer on options
- The Recycle Your Electricals brand guidelines
- Proud supporter of Recycle Your Electricals campaign logo as a png, eps
- QR code directing people to the Recycle Your Electricals homepage

#### What can I recycle?

- Anything with a plug, battery or cable can be recycled or reused! The materials from recycled electricals can be
  used in everything from children's playgrounds to lifesaving equipment, while donated tech can help bridge the
  digital divide.
- You'll find this symbol on all your electrical items. It is a reminder to recycle your old electricals, rather than binning them. [crossed out wheelie bin symbol].



# Website copy - minimum requirement (cont..)

#### **Reducing waste electricals**

- As part of our commitment to reducing the amount of unwanted electrical waste being incinerated or sent to landfill sites, we'll recycle your old electricals free of charge when you buy new ones. Together we can stop precious resources from being lost forever, save lives and help protect the planet.
- Every year, we collect, reuse and recycle thousands of tonnes of old electrical and electronic equipment...
- We take all your old electricals to a recycling plant for processing and separate into individual materials, so they can be turned into new, more useful things. Watch this film about how your old electricals are recycled.

# **Staff training - key points**

#### Electrical recycling story

- o Discarded waste electricals is the fastest growing waste stream in the world
- Everything with a plug, battery, cable can be recycled and turned into anything from children's playgrounds to life saving equipment
- o If you're replacing old electricals, don't forget to recycle the old one; if it's still working you can donate it
- Reuse and recycling locator online search 'recycle your electricals'
- As part of our commitment to reducing the amount of unwanted electricals being incinerated or sent to landfill sites, we'll recycle your old electricals free of charge/ when you buy a new one from us (like-for-like)
